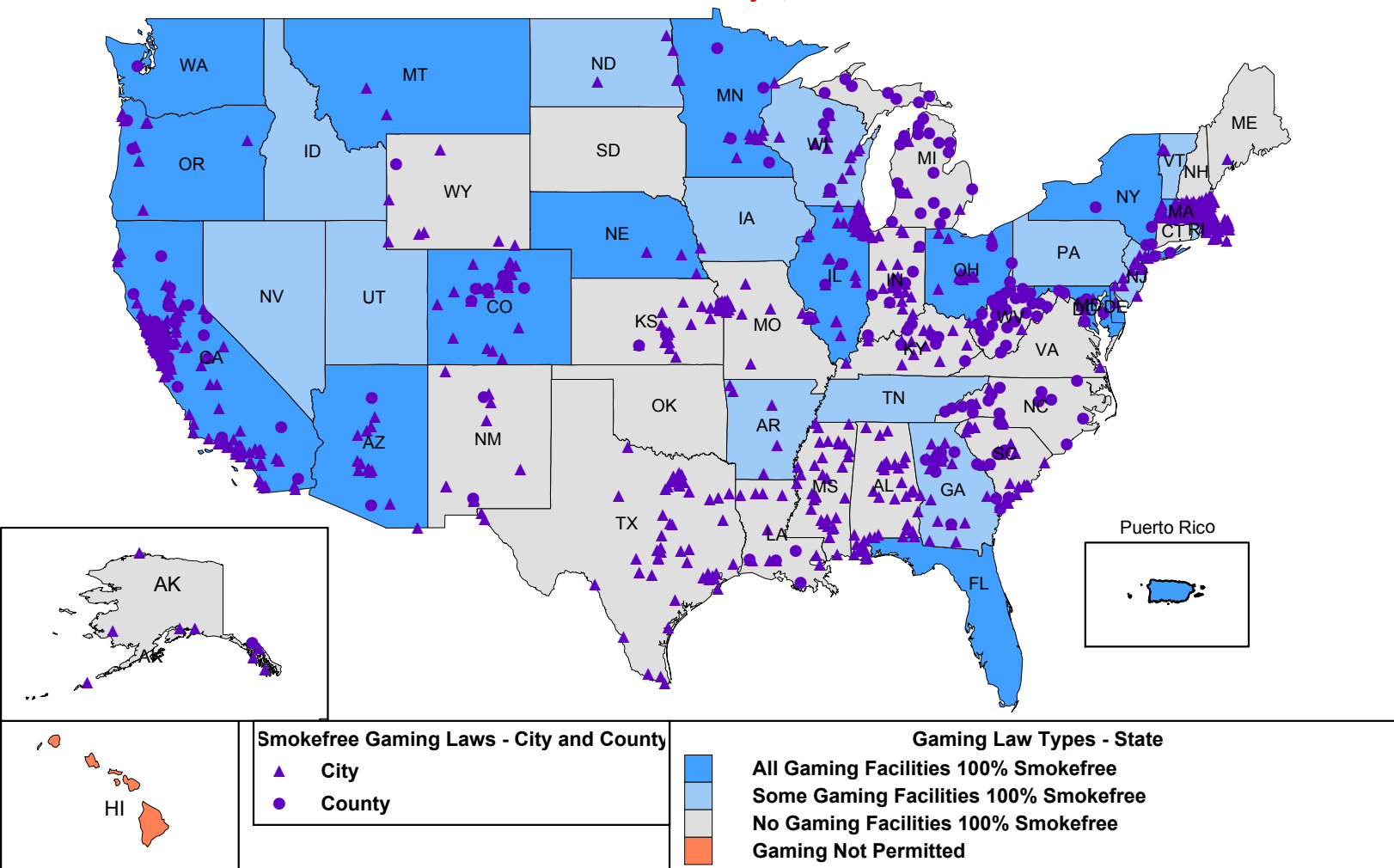


Smokefree Gaming Laws

Enacted as of July 5, 2010



Note: Tribally owned and operated casinos are sovereign entities and are not reflected on the map.
 * The majority of city and county gaming laws are smokefree bingo laws.

Gaming includes: commercial casinos, race tracks and racinos, jai alai, bingo and charitable gaming, card clubs, video lottery terminals, pari-mutuel gaming, keno, pull tabs, etc.

15 states plus Puerto Rico (and USVI, not represented on this map) have enacted 100% smokefree laws for all state regulated gaming. Note: American Indian and Alaska Native sovereign tribal laws are not reflected on this map.

TYPES OF GAMING & 100% SMOKEFREE COVERAGE BY STATE as of JULY 5, 2010

The following grid indicates which type of commercial gaming each state has and whether or not it is protected by a 100% smokefree law.

N/A Indicates that the state does not have that type of state-regulated gaming

Bold Indicates that the state has some type of 100% smokefree gaming

* Indicates tribally owned and operated casinos exist in state; however, these are sovereign entities and not reflected in the map or chart

* **Michigan:** Smoking prohibited in casinos, except in gaming areas of casinos in existence as of May 1, 2010.

South Dakota enacted a 100% smokefree restaurant, bar, and gaming facilities law, which was scheduled to go into effect on July 1, 2009, but which has been suspended by a referendum placing the law on the ballot in November 2010, and which will not go into effect unless approved by the voters.
