

## 100% SMOKEFREE CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES

July 1, 2008

### Federal

In July 2004, the Federal Bureau of Prisons made all its facilities 100% smokefree. Correctional facility inmates, employees, and visitors must observe the policy. The [American Jail Association](#), the American Correctional Association, and the [National Commission on Correctional Health \(NCCHC\)](#) have adopted smokefree resolutions that promote smokefree policies in jails and prisons – these are recommendations not mandates.
